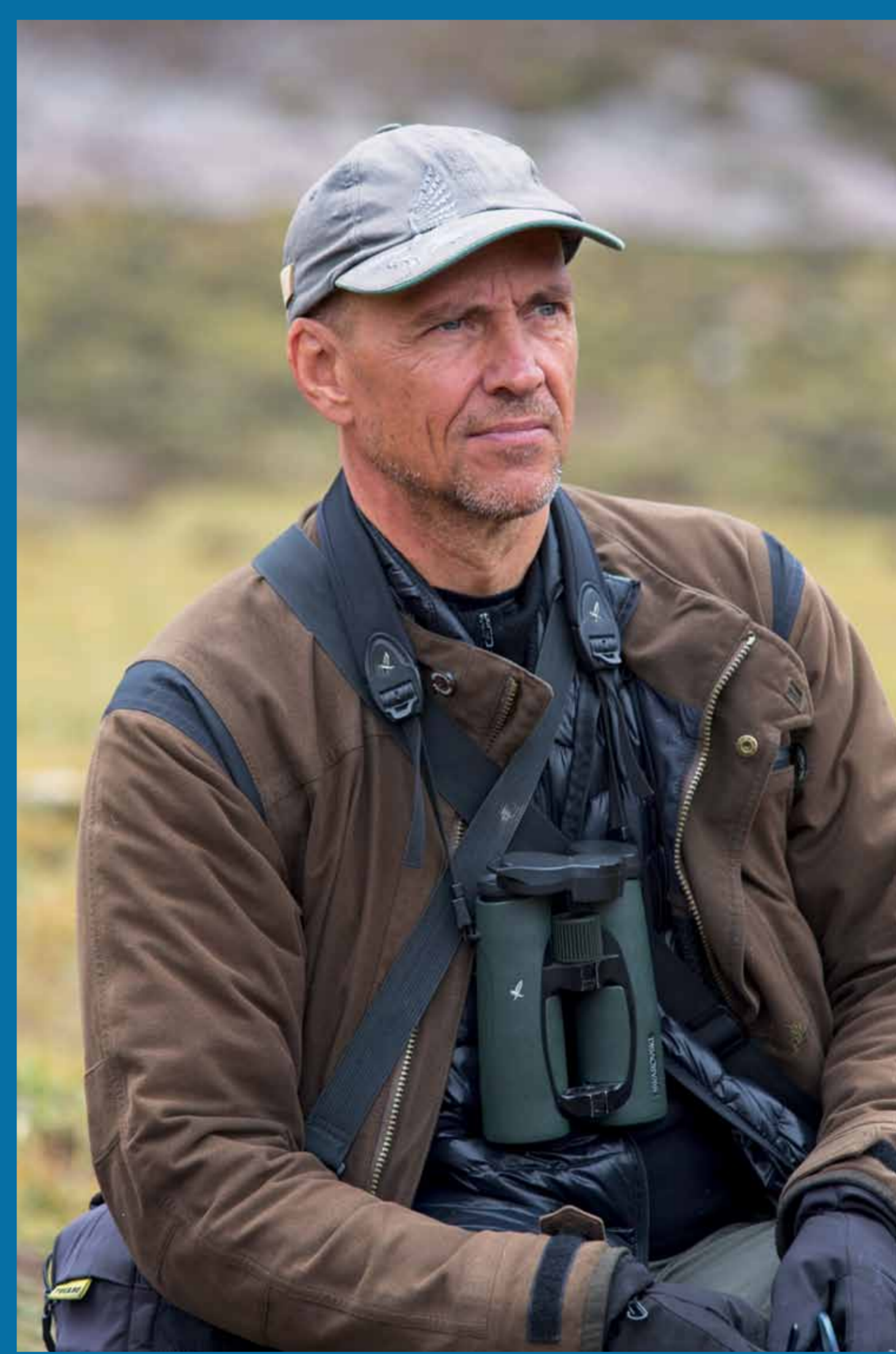


# Festival Talks Programme
